Mewari is the language spoken in the Mewar region of Rajasthan. It is the second largest dialect in Rajasthan and has a vital role in Rajasthani literature. The speakers of this language are not one homogenous ethnic group, but rather a mixture of different castes and tribes. They are mainly agriculturists and businessmen. Camel farming, goat farming, marble and stone work are also a significant part of the economy. Mewari speakers are very religious and among them are adherents of Hinduism, Jainism, and Islam. Some Christian agencies are working in the Mewar region but Christianity doesn't have any significant presence. Almost all the villages are untouched with the Gospel except some of the tribal villages. Most Christian agencies are concentrating their work only among tribals. The higher caste Hindus are yet to be reached. There is a need for Bible translation into the Mewari language.

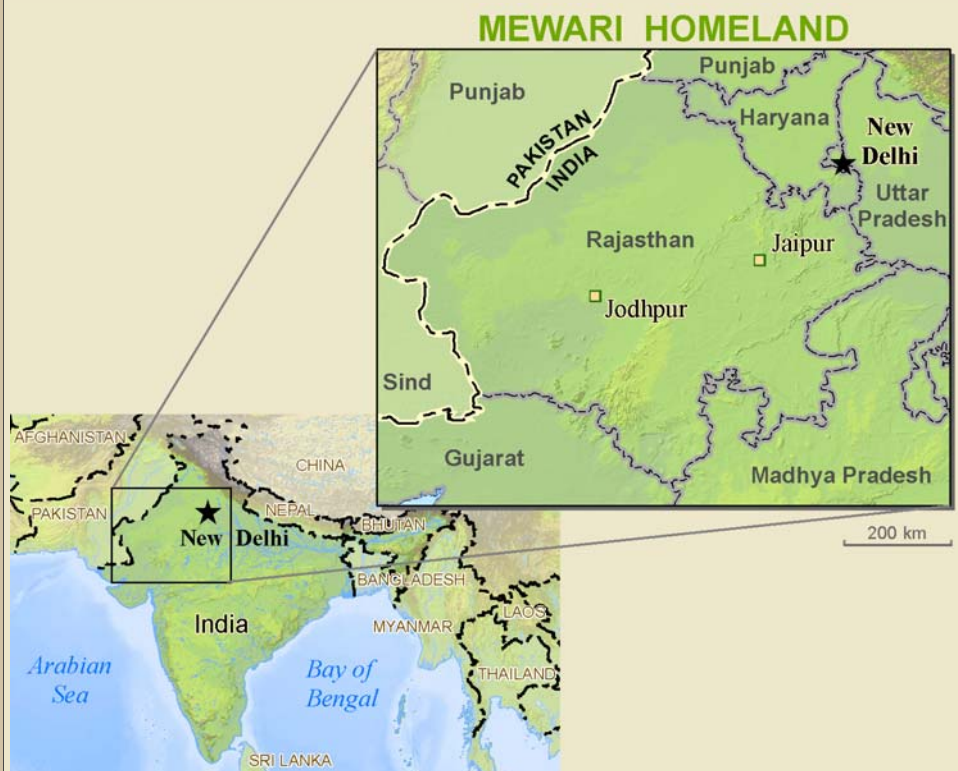
